The Virtue of Love

Opening Prayer

Lord teach us to pray:

Our Father...

The Reading

(to be read by the Leader)

If I speak in human and angelic tongues but do not have love, I am a resounding gong or a clashing cymbal. And if I have the gift of prophecy and comprehend all mysteries and all knowledge; if I have all faith so as to move mountains but do not have love, I am nothing.

If I give away everything I own, and if I hand my body over so that I may boast but do not have Love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient, love is kind. It is not lealous. [love] is not pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

So faith, hope, love remain, these three; but the greatest of these is love 1st Corinthians 13, 1-7, 13)

The Reflection

(to be read by the leader)

The Reading is a favourite in wedding Liturgies because of this one important word "Love". But Paul gualifies already this love with many other virtues which surround this focus on love. In the end, the Apostle reminds us that faith and hope end but love remains and that is simply because, as John tells us, "God is love" (1 John 4, 16). In Jesus this love of God became incarnate, it appeared in human flesh that we as humans would be able to love like God. The love of ourselves and of our neighbour is the practice

field of our love to God. Because love is so important in our Christian life it is the first pillar of our Order: Charity. Without charity the Knights of Columbus would be a lifeless bunch of men, wilting flowers in the garden of humanity.

The first encyclical of Pope Benedict XVI was dedicated to this theme: Deus caritas est - God is Love. Read it if you have a chance during the cold winter nights; it will warm your heart. The Pope calls Charity the practice of love by the Church as a community of love. The Councils should be communities of love, like the parishes, like the families. In the time of the early Church in Rome, pagans observed the Christians and commented, "See how they love each other." It would be great if that could be said of our Order as well: "See, how they love each other."

Meditation Period

(The leader now invites the members to spend a few moments in silent reflection, as the above text is not meant to be a ready-made answer but a starter for personal reflection on the theme.)

Fraternal Sharing

(The leader now invites the members to share with their Brother Knights any relevant thoughts that came to them during the meditation period.)

Closing Prayer

(Recited by all) (From the Encyclical Deus caritas est)

Holy Mary Mother of God, you have given the world its true light. Jesus, your son--the Son of God. You abandoned yourself completely to God's call and thus became a wellspring of goodness which flows from him. Show us Jesus. Lead us to him. Teach us to know and love him, so that we too can become capable of true love and be fountains of living water in the midst of a thirsting world. Amen.
