## The Virtue of Justice

## **Opening Prayer**

Lord teach us to pray:

#### Our Father...

*The Reading* (to be read by the Leader)

But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, though testified to by the law and the prophets, the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction; all have sinned and are deprived of the glory of God. They are justified freely by his grace through the redemption in Christ Jesus, whom God set forth as an expiation, through faith, by his blood, to prove his righteousness because of the forgiveness of sins previously committed, through the forbearance of God-to prove his righteousness in the present time, that he might be righteous and justify the one who has faith in Jesus. ( Romans 3, 21-26)

> The Reflection (to be read by the leader)

The scriptures of the Old and New Testament are full of statements on justification or righteousness which includes all moral behaviour and includes particularly our right behaviour towards God and our neighbour. Our duties toward God mainly as described in the first commandments and their interpretation by the precepts of the Church; the second part of the commandments orders the relationship to others and oneself. We all know the classical meaning of the commandments but do we also think of modern application. E.g. Our behaviour in traffic: speeding, distracted behaviour, alcohol, cursing at other drivers and many other things. It is the justice of common courtesy which Should drive our behaviour. All justice is direct towards the common good. The common good should be the object of all in Leadership positions. A true leader is the servant of all. Furthermore justice appears in the form of social justice. Although it is specified in theology since the beginning of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, it is still a hidden treasure particularly for radical capitalists. The two major principles of social justice are solidarity and subsidiarity. Solidarity is what we Knights are to practice through our pillar of Unity. Solidarity shows itself in the just distribution of goods, a just remuneration for work and the desire to establish this whole order. Subsidiarity is the principle that the immediate lower community should do the work and the higher up community should not interfere but help when the lower community that cannot manage anymore. Eg. A project should be done by a Council. If the Council cannot manage, the State should help without interfering with the Council.

As revenue for Council 4742 is always carefully scrutinized, so also should all spending and other expenses be considered. The following strategies (particularly for charitable donations/gifts) involving the spending of Council moneys shall be followed:

1."Charity Begins at Home"

Expenses for "local" needs will be our first priority

+ Parish needs (eg. the 150<sup>th</sup> celebration)

+ School requests (eg. Bibles, Awards) + Youth (eg. Education needs, World Youth Days, Pizza, Pizza,)

+ Community (eg. Community Garden,Rose Garden

+ Parishioners (eg. Wheel chair ramp, scooter)

+ Care for the poor

+ Parishioners (eg. Wheel chair ramp, scooter)

+ Care for the poor

2. Vocations/Seminarian Support

We will seek out a seminarian (cf. Father Roger Rouleau) to assist with an annual financial contribution to assist in the educational needs of that candidate (eg. purchase of books)

3. "Outside" St. Albert

+ All such requests will be debated as to the "worthwhileness" of the request

+ Many of these requests will become "budgeted"

+ Focus will continue to be the building of Catholicism

+ State/Archdiocese requests will be considered (eg. St. Joseph's Seminary)

The "use" of all accounts will be considered. The Columbus Club will remain intact in the event of that future "rainy day" need or in the event of a major activity for the improvement/betterment of our parish (eg. as was the case with the new kitchen)
