May 2013 Meeting The Virtue of Integrity

Opening Prayer

Lord teach us to pray: Our Father...

The Reading

(to be read by the Leader)

Then let my enemy pursue and overtake me, trample my life to the ground, and leave me dishonoured in the dust.

Rise up, LORD, in your anger;
rise against the fury of my foes.

The Reflection

(to be read by the leader)

The Psalms are full of this term—integrity and it gives us advice to attain it. It is the logo of our present State administration: *Men of Integrity*. Did anyone ever meditate what that means to us?

Integer in mathematics refers to a whole number, of many parts made one. The Latin poet Ovid applied it already to morality when he uses the term, "integer vitae" which is rightly translated as "honest life". That is certainly a great ideal to accomplish.

Wholeness is a unity combined from many parts. We all experience how fractured our life is; it needs a unifying factor and that is our faith knowledge and practice. Here is all one because it comes from God who is one. Wholeness also

refers to time. As we live now in an age of technology, our moral values are human and cannot be controlled by a computer.

The term integrity includes also the notion of soundness. It is interesting that we use this term when we make an important decision in our lives. In our Last Will and Testament we state "being of sound mind". Soundness is this integrity—wholeness of mind—sane and reasonable. We all are very much saddened when we meet people with dementia who have become feeble in their mind. Let us try to use our mental facilities properly as long as we can enjoy them.

Integrity also includes the meaning of honesty. We all have heard the saying: "Honesty is the best policy." In all our actions we should keep our honesty and respect the honour of our fellow man.

Be men of integrity.

Prayers to Saints

St. Anthony of Padua is well known as the Catholic patron saint of lost items, the poor and travelers. How often have you heard someone say "... . I have to pray to Saint Anthony to help me find my lost _____ ." Many times a donation to St. Anthony follows the finding of the lost item. Older un-remodeled churches most always count St. Anthony among their pantheon of statues. The saint of Padua is usually sculpted or portrayed holding the child Jesus—or a lily—or a book—or all three—in his arms. A bank of vigil lights will burn in front of the statue.

Another is the Apostle Saint Jude Thaddeu, "The Miraculous Saint," the Catholic <u>Patron Saint</u> of "lost causes" and "cases despaired of." When all other avenues are closed, he is the one to call upon, and his help often comes at the last moment. Following is a prayer seeking St. Jude's help...

O Holy St. Jude, Apostle and Martyr, great in virtue and rich in miracles, near kinsmen of all who invoke your special patronage in time of need. To you I have recourse from the depth of my heart and humble beg to whom God has given such great power to come to my assistance. Help me in my present urgent petition. In return I promise to make your name known and cause you to be invoked. Say three Our Fathers, three Hail Mary's, and three Glory Be to the Father. Publication must be promised.
