

MESSAGE FROM THE GRAND KNIGHT

Greetings Worthy Brother Knights.

Fall is upon us and the Knights of Columbus Council 4742 2012/13 Columbian Year is starting to get busier. We started off our Columbian year with a very well attended Pancake Breakfast Sunday after both the 9:00 and 11:00 a.m. masses on September 9th. I would ask that Brother Knights continue to help out at this monthly event as it is a highly visible event for the Knights and has become a staple in our Parish. No matter which mass you attend, please make an effort to come downstairs for a delicious breakfast with your family. If you attend the Saturday mass come back on Sunday morning. If you attend either the 9:00 or 11:00 a.m. mass please help out at the other sitting. I have witnessed Brother Knights and their families leaving the church on Pancake Sunday and not attending the breakfast. I would like to see this change and Brother Knights supporting Knight Events!

The first Executive meeting was well attended and the year got off on the right foot. The Executive meeting, held the first Monday of every month, will now begin at 6:30 p.m. I was very happy to see all the Brother Knights that came out to the September General Meeting. Our Council Chambers were full. At the meeting we voted to make a donation of \$1,000 to our Brother Knights in the NWT that are raising funds to attend the canonization of Sister Kateri Tekakwitha. She is the first <u>Native American</u> woman to be venerated in the Roman Catholic Church. She was <u>beatified</u> by <u>Blessed Pope John Paul II</u> in 1980. She is scheduled to be formally canonized on October 21, 2012.

Knights of Columbus and CWL Sunday will be held Sunday, October 14th at both the 9:00 and 11:00 a.m. masses. The Knights will also be hosting our Pancake Breakfast after each of those masses. We need a strong show of Knights and their families at both masses and the breakfasts. Please come out and make a morning of it.

And lastly, we signed up no fewer than ten prospective candidates at Expo 2012 on Sunday, September 30th. At the Executive Meeting the next evening we decided that the October General Meeting on Wednesday, October 17th would be a First Degree to allow us to bring these Candidates into our Council at the first opportunity. The Br. Anthony Council First Degree Team will conduct the ceremonial for us. With the expected large crowd we have booked the Church Hall for the event. It will start at 7:00 p.m. promptly. Please try to arrive between 6:30 and 6:45 p.m. We will have a brief meeting prior to the First Degree then a longer than usual Social afterwards. Again we need as many Knights out as possible to welcome these Candidates to our Council. Please plan to attend.
